BRIEF

As part of EiC Week, Knowsley's CLCs offered a range of special activities to celebrate the learning resources available in the Borough's City Learning Centres. A range of e-learning resources for Key Stages 1 – 4 were offered

DESCRIPTION

Activities included 'Interactive Explorers' a virtual exploration of the jungle to support Geography, Science and Maths at Key Stages 1 & 2, following on from the summer school August 03. Parkbrow and Ravenscroft Schools take up the challenge!

Secondary students took up the "Maths in Motion" a simulation based on Formula 1 motor racing to support the NC curriculum at Key Stage 3 and GCSE at Key Stage 4.
